A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF KING COUNTY WATER DISTRICT NO. 125, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON, ESTABLISHING A GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSION REDUCTION POLICY.

WHEREAS, the King County Water District No. 125 ("District") is a special purpose municipal corporation authorized and existing under the laws of the State of Washington, Title 57 RCW, and is authorized by law to provide water utility service within its service area located in King County; and

WHEREAS, in 2008, the Washington State Legislature adopted chapter 70.235 RCW entitled "Limiting Greenhouse Gas Emissions"; and


WHEREAS, in 2009, the Washington State Legislature amended chapter 70.235 RCW to include RCW 70.235.070 requiring state agencies to consider whether funding recipients have adopted policies for the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions; and


WHEREAS, the District may apply to certain state agencies for capital funding subject to the requirements of RCW 70.235.070; and the District desires to adopt policies for the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions in accordance with RCW 70.235.070 to maintain eligibility for state capital funding for infrastructure and economic development projects; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of King County Water District No. 125, King County, Washington, as follows:

Section 1. The Greenhouse Gas Emission Reduction Policy attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated herein in full by this reference is hereby approved and adopted effective the date set forth below.



EXHIBIT A

Greenhouse Gas Reduction Program

The following items make up the program that the District will follow to reduce and promote the reduction of greenhouse gasses:

- Promote use of available technologies
- Conduct energy audits of District facilities and evaluate potential conservation measures.
- Encourage purchase of energy star rated equipment and appliances.
- Promote weatherization programs for existing District buildings.
- Encourage energy conservation practices in buildings by raising the awareness of energy use.
- Evaluate telecommuting options.
- Consider the use of cleaner fuels and vehicles.
- Encourage ride-sharing, van-pooling, and alternate transportation such as walking or biking.
- Evaluate flex-time schedules.
- Implement a solid waste strategy through recycling and reuse.
- Promote recycling programs, purchasing policies to reduce the amount of waste produced.
- Provide and maintain a water conservation program.
- Consider the use and promotion of reclaimed water.
- Install and promote water efficient landscapes and irrigation.
