RESOLUTION NO. 13-03-5-455

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF KING COUNTY WATER DISTRICT NO. 125 REVISING AND ESTABLISHING WATER SERVICE RATES AND CHARGES, AND REPEALING AND SUPERSEDING RESOLUTION NO. 13-01-09-453.

WHEREAS, RCW 57.08.081 authorizes King County Water District No. 125 ("District") to fix rates and charges for providing water service, such rates and charges to be fixed as deemed necessary by the District Board of Commissioners so that uniform charges will be made for the same class of customer or service and facility; and

WHEREAS, RCW 57.08.081 authorizes the District Board of Commissioners in classifying customers to consider in its discretion several factors including the difference in cost to various customers; the location of the various customers within and without the District; the difference in cost of maintenance, operation, repair and replacement of the various parts of the system; the different character of the service provided to various customers; the quantity and quality of the service and facility furnished; the time of its use; the achievement of water conservation goals and the discouragement of wasteful practices; and any other matters which present a reasonable difference as a ground for distinction in the establishment of water service rates and charges; and

WHEREAS, the District Board of Commissioners previously established water service rates for all customer classifications by the adoption of Resolution No. 13-01-09-453 and

WHEREAS, the District contracted with PACE Engineers ("Consultant") to review and update the District's water service rates and commodity charges; and

WHEREAS, the Consultant recommended that the District's service rates and charges now be updated and revised and that certain customer classifications have block and seasonal rates to achieve water conservation goals and to discourage wasteful practices as set forth on **Exhibit A** attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference; and the District Board of Commissioners having the recommendations of the Consultant and District staff; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of King County Water District No. 125 as follows:

1. Definitions:

(a) "Residential" shall mean a residence designed or used for residential occupancy as a residential unit such as a single family residence, apartment, condominium, trailer court stall or mobile home lot (a "Unit") up to a maximum of five (5) Units.

(b) "Multi Family Residential" shall mean more than five (5) Units.

(c) "Commercial", "Industrial" and "Non-Residential" shall mean all uses and customers other than Residential and Multi Family Residential uses and customers as defined herein.

2. The updated and revised water service base rates and commodity charges set forth on **Exhibit A** are hereby approved and adopted and all District customer classes shall pay the base rates and commodity charges to the District for water service that is made available by the District and water that is consumed by the customer when billed by the District in accordance with the District's billing and collection resolutions, policies and procedures.
3. All District resolutions, policies and procedures, including Resolution No. 13-01-09-453, are hereby modified, repealed and superseded to be in accordance with this resolution effective **March 20, 2013**.



EXHIBIT A

**KING COUNTY WATER DISTRICT NO. 125
WATER SERVICE RATES AND CHARGES
CCF = 100 CUBIC FEET**

Meter Size (for all uses including residential, multi family residential, non-residential, commercial and industrial)	Monthly Base Rate
5/8 x 3/4 - inch	\$12.50/month
1 – inch	\$17.00/month
1.5 – inch	\$26.00/month
2 – inch	\$42.00/month
3 – inch	\$80.00/month
4 – inch	\$150.00/month
6 – inch	\$275.00/month
8 – inch	\$400.00/month

In addition to the above-referenced base rate for one unit, all residential and multi family residential users shall pay a monthly charge of \$8.00 for each additional unit.

Winter Commodity Charges - Residential (Up to 5 Units) Annual Rate	
0-10 ccf (bi-monthly)	\$3.19 ccf
11-20 ccf (bi-monthly)	\$3.59 ccf
21 and over (bi-monthly)	\$3.94 ccf

Summer Commodity Charges - Residential (Up to 5 Units) Annual Rate	
0-10 ccf (bi-monthly)	\$3.30 ccf
11-20 ccf (bi-monthly)	\$3.70 ccf
21 and over (bi-monthly)	\$4.05 ccf

Commodity Charges – Multi Family Residential (over 5 Units) and Non-Residential (such as Commercial and Industrial)	
Winter Rate	\$3.19 ccf
Summer Rate	\$3.70 ccf

The **Winter Rate** for commodity charges shall apply from **October 20 to June 20**.
The **Summer Rate** for commodity charges shall apply from **June 21 to October 19**.

Commodity Charge for Irrigation and Temporary Meter Use: \$4.05 ccf

Wholesale Rates to other Municipal Water Suppliers: A base rate based on meter size as set forth above plus a consumption charge equal to the City of Seattle wholesale water rate to the District shall be charged other municipal water suppliers receiving water from the District on a wholesale basis.

Water Drawn Directly from District Hydrants: A per day rate of \$5.00 and commodity consumption charges as set forth above shall be charged for water drawn directly from District Hydrants.

2 inch	\$26.00
3 inch	\$34.00
4 inch	\$56.00
6 inch	\$114.00
8 inch	\$180.00
10 inch	\$280.00

Commodity Charges: In addition to the monthly base rate for standby fire protection services which shall be paid by District customers with separate water meters for fire protection, commodity charges for water used for fire protection purposes shall be paid when billed by the District at the non-residential commodity charge per CCF set forth in this **Exhibit A**.
