

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Commissioners of Water District #125, King County, Washington approving an amendment to the 1977 Agreement with Water District No. 20 and others for operation of the 6 million gallon reservoir facility.

WHEREAS, The aforementioned Water Districts have entered into a general operating agreement, a part of which governs the interchange of water between Districts, and

WHEREAS, each District buys its water for resale from the City of Seattle, and said City of Seattle has now changed its rate structure from that existing in 1977, and

WHEREAS, in order to establish an equitable rate for exchange of water between Districts as a consequence of the Seattle rate change, it is mutually agreed that the 1977 agreement be modified.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved that by mutual agreement, the rules for interchange of water between participating Districts be hereby amended in this and no other way.

1. Under the City of Seattle new rate schedule, for old and new water, the Districts agree to use the same time period for old water (January 1, 1979 - December 31, 1981) for calculating charges for water delivered by Water District No. 20, to Water District No. 125. Total water transferred in this three year base period (old water allowance) was 28,781,500 cubic feet; or 9,593,832 cubic feet annually. This amount is designated as old water. All other water delivered will be designated new water.
